The Board met on 02.03.2022 at 03:00 PM to consider the cases for premature release of convicts undergoing Life sentence in pursuance to the meeting notice issued by Dy. Secretary (Home), GNCT of Delhi vide reference no. F.18/102/2003/HG/P-VIII/2021/427-435 dated 22.02.2022.

A total of 28 number of cases of life convicts were placed before the Board (25 fresh cases and 03 rejected cases). Rejected cases were considered in view of Rule 1257 (d) of DPR, 2018.

All the cases placed before the Board were discussed at length and considered in the light of parameters as mentioned in Delhi Prison Rules, 2018. Factors like conduct of the prisoner during confinement, his/her age, the circumstances under which the crime was committed (premeditated or in spur of the moment), nature & gravity of crime, perversity and brutality of the offence committed by the convict, whether the convict is casual or habitual offender, his/her antecedents, apprehension expressed by his/her family members, propensity of committing crime again or not, his lodgment, parole/furlough availed and conduct during parole/furlough as well as in Jail, prospects of post release rehabilitation, family responsibilities, possibility of the convict returning as a useful member of the society, court orders etc. were also considered by the Board and accordingly its recommendations were given.

The Board was informed about the following:-

- (I) That the recommendation of the Board for premature release of the convicts shall be placed before the Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor, Govt. of National Capital Territory of Delhi for approval / consideration.
- (II) That the custody period i.e. expired portion of sentence in the 28 cases placed before the Board has been computed as on 31.12.2021.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 02 months & 28 days **in actual** and 16 years, 09 months & 19 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 06 times and Furlough 13 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has opposed his premature release in its report.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has submitted that he may be considered for granting premature release by the SRB in its report.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, consistent satisfactory jail conduct throughout incarceration, no adverse report during parole and furlough availed, no previous involvement in any other criminal case, showing reformatory attitude etc., the Board unanimously

RECOMMENDS premature release of convict Aleem Khan @ Karan Singh S/o Sh. Noorullah.



02. ASHOK KUMAR S/O SH. BALWANT SINGH — AGE-55 YRS.

Ashok Kumar S/o Sh. Balwant Singh is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 572/2007, U/S 302/120-B IPC, P.S. Mandawali, Delhi for murder of his wife over strained relation.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 01 Month & 11 days **in actual** and 18 years & 16 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 03 times and Furlough 01 time.

Recommendation by Police:


The Delhi Police has opposed his premature release in its report.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **recommended** his premature release in its report.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, consistent satisfactory jail conduct throughout incarceration, the convict having no previous criminal history, no adverse report during parole and furlough availed etc., the Board unanimously **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Ashok Kumar S/o Sh. Balwant Singh.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years & 29 days **in actual** and 16 years, 02 months & 22 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 05 times and Furlough 03 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has **strongly opposed** his premature release in its report. The Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime) has also **opposed** his premature release in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has recommended for his premature release in its report. However, the Chief Probation Officer, Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **not supported** the premature release of the convict in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case i.e. the manner in which the offence was committed, gravity and perversity of the crime, un-satisfactory jail conduct having multiple punishments, convict's involvement in other criminal cases etc., the Board unanimously **REJECTS** the premature release of convict Jaswant Singh S/o Sh. Dhyan Singh at this stage.







04. JITENDER SINGH S/O SH. HODAL SINGH — AGE-52 YRS.

Jitender Singh S/o Sh. Hodal Singh is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 735/1997, U/S 302 IPC, P.S. Sultan Puri, Delhi for murder of his mother over property dispute.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years & 16 days **in actual** and 17 years, 09 months & 20 days **with remission**. He has availed Interim bails 05 times, Parole 09 times and Furlough 15 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has **not recommended** his premature release in its report. The Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime) has also **opposed** his premature release in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has recommended his premature release in its report. However, the Chief Probation Officer, Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **not supported** the premature release of the convict in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, the manner in which the offence was committed, gravity and perversity of the crime etc., the Board unanimously **REJECTS** the premature release of convict Jitender Singh S/o Sh. Hodal Singh at this stage.







05. MAHESH BALWANI S/O SH. NARAIN DASS — AGE-59 YRS.

Mahesh Balwani S/o Sh. Narain Dass is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 325/1993, U/S 302/326/392/397/34 IPC, P.S. Shalimar Bagh, Delhi for murdering of a woman (known relative) during robbery.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 19 days **in actual** and 17 years, 02 months & 10 days **with remission**. He has availed Interim bail 01 time, Parole 03 times and Furlough 06 times.

Recommendation by Police:


The Delhi Police has opposed his premature release in its report. However, the Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime) has not opposed in view of the discussions held in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **recommended** the premature release of the convict in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Social Welfare Department, Delhi has also **supported** the premature release of the convict in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, the convict having no previous criminal history, satisfactory jail conduct during incarceration, no adverse report during interim bail/parole/furlough availed, showing reformatory attitude etc., the Board unanimously **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Mahesh Balwani S/o Sh. Narain Dass.

Recommendation by Police:



The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 01 month & 06 days **in actual** and 16 years, 08 months & 02 days **with remission**. She has availed Parole 08 times and Furlough 11 times.

Recommendation by Police:



Imprisonment of 14 years, 24 days **in actual** and 16 years, 28 days **with remission**. She has availed Parole 05 times and Furlough 05 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has **not opposed** her premature release in its report. The Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime) has also **supported** her premature release in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **recommended** her premature release in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Social Welfare Department, Delhi has also **supported** premature release of the convict in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, the convict having no previous criminal history, improvement in jail conduct, no adverse report during parole/furlough availed, showing reformatory attitude etc., the Board unanimously **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Manju @ Geeta W/o Sh. Harbir Singh.

09. MANSI W/O SH. LAXMAN — AGE- 49 YRS.

Manshi W/o Sh. Laxman is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 898/2007, U/S 302/120-B/34 IPC, P.S. Uttam Nagar, Delhi for murder of a person by giving poisonous substance.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 11 days **in actual** and 15 years, 09 months & 29 days **with remission**. She has availed Parole 06 times and Furlough 10 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has submitted in its report to consider the case of convict for premature release. The Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime) has also stated that in view of the discussions held in the meeting, her premature release may be considered.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has recommended her premature release in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Social Welfare Department, Delhi has also **supported** premature release of the convict in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, the convict having no previous criminal history, satisfactory jail conduct except a minor punishment in 2016, no adverse report during parole/furlough availed, showing reformatory attitude etc., the Board unanimously **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Manshi W/o Sh. Laxman.



10. MANOJ KUMAR VERMA S/O SH. DAYA SHANKAR — AGE-51 YRS.

Manoj Kumar Verma S/o Sh. Daya Shankar is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 632/1995, U/S 302 IPC, P.S. Kalka Ji, Delhi for murder of a lady/neighbour over money dispute.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 01 month & 07 days **in actual** and 17 years, 01 month & 01 day **with remission**. He has availed I. Bail 01 time, Parole 05 times and Furlough 15 times.

Recommendation by Police:



Imprisonment of 14 years, 02 months and 10 days **in actual** and 16 years, 03 months and 21 days **with remission**. He has availed I. Bail 02 times, Parole 09 times and Furlough 11 times.

Recommendation by Police:


The Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime) has not opposed his premature release in the meeting.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 01 month & 21 days **in actual** and 17 years, 07 months and 29 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 05 times and Furlough 14 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime) has **opposed** his premature release in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has submitted in its report that this case may be recommended for premature release. However, The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi in view of the discussion held in the meeting did **not support** his premature release.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances under which the crime was committed i.e. murder of a person for robbery, un-satisfactory jail conduct having punishments, the gravity, perversity & heinousness of the crime etc., the Board unanimously **REJECTS** premature release of convict Naresh Kumar S/o Sh. Ram Singh at this stage.

The Delhi Police has opposed his premature release in its report. However, the Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime) has not opposed in view of the discussions held in the meeting. Hometown Police has **no objection** for his premature release in its report.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **recommended** for premature release in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Social Welfare Department, Delhi has also **supported** premature release of the convict in the meeting

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case i.e. convict having no previous criminal history, improvement in jail conduct, no adverse report during parole/furlough availed, showing reformatory attitude etc., the Board unanimously **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Rahul Kumar Raman Bhai Choudhry S/o Sh. Choudhry Raman Bhai.

14. SANJAY KUMAR S/O SH. ATTAR SINGH — AGE-49 YRS.

Sanjay Kumar S/o Sh. Attar Singh is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 121/1994, U/S 302/307/120-B/34 IPC, P. S. Kanjhawala, Delhi for murder of a person over property dispute.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 01 month & 25 days **in actual** and 16 years, 11 months & 03 days **with remission**. He has availed I. Bail 01 time, Parole 06 times and Furlough 13 times.

Recommendation by Police:


The Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime) has stated that in view of the discussions held in the meeting, his premature release may be considered.

Satbir Singh @ Satyavir Singh S/o Sh. Raghubir Singh is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 133/1997, U/S 302/34 IPC, P.S. Kamla Market, Delhi for murder of a person over old enmity.

The convict has undergone:



Recommendation by Police:

The Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime) has not opposed his premature release in view of the discussions held in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has recommended premature release of the convict in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Social Welfare Department, Delhi has also **supported** premature release of the convict in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, improvement in jail conduct, no adverse report during interim bail/parole/furlough availed, shown reformatory attitude and orientation towards being a useful member of the society etc., the Board unanimously **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Sohan Pal @ Suresh @ Soda S/o Sh. Roshan Lal.

19. SURENDER SINGH S/O SH. RAJ SINGH — AGE-56 YRS.

Surender Singh S/o Sh. Raj Singh is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 534/2007, U/S 302/201/34 IPC, P. S. Sarojini Nagar, Delhi for murder of his wife over issue of property as well as strained relations by multiple stabbing and strangulation.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 02 months & 11 days **in actual** and 16 years 07 months and 27 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 03 times and Furlough 01 time.

Recommendation by Police:

The Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime) has **opposed** his premature release in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has submitted that he may **not be recommended** for premature release in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi also did **not support** his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, the manner in which the offence was committed, gravity, heinousness and perversity of the crime, not recommended by social welfare department in its social investigation report etc., the Board unanimously **REJECTS** premature release of convict Surender Singh S/o Sh. Raj Singh at this stage.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 06 months & 27 days **in actual** and 15 years, 10 months & 16 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 01 time.

Recommendation by Police:





After taking into account all the facts and circumstances, the manner in which the crime took place i.e. murder of her daughter-in-law for dowry by setting her ablaze, gravity and perversity of the crime etc., the Board unanimously **REJECTS** premature release of convict Rajwati W/o Sh. Mahender Singh at this stage.

Recommendation by Police:

The Commissioner of Police, Amritsar in its report mentioned that the verification may be considered clear from any criminal angle. However, the Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime) has **opposed** his premature release in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Chief Probation Officer, Social Welfare Department, Delhi did **not support** his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

A detailed discussion was held with regard to the premature release of the convict in view of longevity of incarceration, his medical condition, report of Commissioner of Police Amritsar, social investigation report of District Probation Officer, Amritsar and also the communication of Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India vide letter reference no. V-17013/25/2019-PR dated 27.09.2019. The manner and nature of the crime committed by the convict was also discussed at length. After a long discussion, no consensus could be arrived at among the members of the Board. It was, therefore, decided that the case **may be deferred** for the next meeting and by that time the members of the Board were requested to examine the relevant documents regarding premature release of the convict Devender Pal Singh Bhullar S/o Late Sh. The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 21 years, 01 month and 09 days **in actual** and 25 years and 06 days **with remission**. He has never availed I. Bail, Parole or Furlough (as per Commutation Roll dated 31.12.2021 received from District Prison Karnal, Haryana).

Recommendation by Police:


The Delhi Police has **strongly opposed** his premature release in its report as well as in the meeting. Hometown Police has **not recommended** his premature release in its report.

Conclusion:


The Board members were apprised of the background of the case, including the fact that his co-convict Shree Bhagwan was released in pursuance to the SRB meeting dated 06.01.2016. The instant case has been put up as per order dated 13.09.2021 of Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in W.P. (Crl.) 523/2021, Crl. M. A. No. 3726/2021 (directions) in the matter of Surender Singh V/s State of NCT of Delhi, directing to place the case of the petitioner for consideration of premature release in the next meeting of the SRB alongwith the necessary documents showing parity between the co-convict Shree Bhagwan and the petitioner as also the minutes of the SRB meeting dated 29.02.2016 in case of Shree Bhagwan (the date of SRB meeting mentioned in the Hon'ble High Court order is incorrect. The correct date is 06.01.2016). The case was considered after taking into account all the necessary documents as mentioned in the order and after a detailed discussion about the convict's satisfactory jail conduct, no adverse report during interim bail/parole/furlough availed, longevity of incarceration etc., the Board unanimously **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Surender Singh S/o Sh. Dharam Singh.


