RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SENTENCE REVIEWING BOARD FOR PREMATURE RELEASE OF LIFE CONVICTS IN THE MEETING HELD UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE HON'BLE HOME MINISTER OF DELHI AT 04:00 PM ON 04.05.2016, AT DELHI SECRETARIAT, NEW DELHI- 110002.

A meeting of the **Sentence Reviewing Board** (hereinafter referred to as **Board**) was held on 04.05.2016 in the Conference room, 7th Level "A" Wing, Delhi Secretariat under the **CHAIRMANSHIP OF HON'BLE HOME MINISTER, NCT OF DELHI**.

On 04.05.2016 at 4:00 P.M., the cases of 26 life convicts, in terms of SRB Guidelines, Hon'ble Supreme Court order dated 02.12.2015 and Hon'ble Supreme Court order dated 22.03.2010 (State of Haryana Vs. Jagdish) were taken up by the Sentence Reviewing Board for recommending premature release on merits. Such premature releases are subject to the approval of Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor, Govt. of National Capital Territory of Delhi. SRB Guidelines issued by the Government of NCT of Delhi vide Order No.F.18/5/94/HOME (G)/3825 dated 16.07.2004 and other related records were taken into consideration. Cases were discussed in the light of parameters like conduct of the prisoner during confinement in jail and parole/furlough, his/her age, the circumstances under which the crime was committed, nature & gravity of crime, his/her antecedents, prospects of rehabilitation, family responsibilities etc. Recommendations of

Jail, Chief Probation Officer, and Police were also taken into consideration while reviewing each case for premature release.

1. ASHOK S/O RAM SINGH----AGE – 55 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.286/90, U/s-302 IPC & 5 TADA ACT Police Station - Jahangir Puri, Delhi, for committing murder of a person over property dispute. The said convict is also convicted in case FIR No. 393/2007, u/s 364A/368/344/347/120B/34 IPC, P.S. Ashok Nagar to undergo Life Imprisonment.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 19 years, 02 month & 15 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 21 years, 01 months & 26 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 01 time. He jumped parole w.e.f. 17.09.02 to 03.03.08.

The Police opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. The home town police report not received in spite of multiple messages, thus presumed not opposed. The Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended premature release of the convict. Home town social investigation report not received in spite of multiple messages, thus presumed not opposed. Ld. ASJ has opposed the premature release of said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, nature of crime, convicted in multiple cases, unsatisfactory work and conduct in jail, jumped parole, non recommendation of police, opposed by Ld ASJ, the Board **REJECTS** the premature release of the convict.

2. PANKAJ BISWAS S/O SUNIL BISWAS - Aged-37 Years

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in Two separate cases i.e. in case FIR No.347/2000, U/S-302/449/396/34 IPC P.S. Chitranjan Park, Delhi and in case FIR No. 133/2000, u/s 302/450/34 IPC P.S. Chitranjan Park for committing murder in dacoity.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 15 years 04 months 24 days and 20 years, 01 month & 16 days including the remission as on 31^{st} of March 2016 in case FIR no. 347/2000 P.S. Chitranjan Park.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 15 years 04 months 13 days and 20 years, 01 month & 05 days including the remission as on 31st of March 2016 in case FIR no. 133/2000 P.S. Chitranjan Park.

The Delhi Police opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. Home town police has also not recommended his premature release. The Probation Officer, Delhi and Hometown have recommended his case for premature release. Ld. ASJ has opposed the premature release of said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, convicted in multiple cases, nature of crime, non recommendation of police, opposed by Ld. ASJ, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

3. JUBER ALAM S/O HABIB-UR RAHMAN —AGE-40 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.31/99, U/S-302/396/34 IPC, Police Station Bara Hindu Rao Delhi for murder of a lady while committing dacoity.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 17 years, 01 month & 24 days excluding the remission as on 31ST of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 20 years, 03 months & 25 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 04 times and furlough 04 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough. His work and conduct has been satisfactory

The Police has opposed premature release in its report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer has recommended his case for premature release. Ld. Addl. Session Judge opposed the premature release of above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, recommendations of Probation Officer and satisfactory work & conduct in jail as well as outside during parole/furlough, the Board **RECOMMENDS** the premature release of the convict.

4. KIRPA SHANKAR @ MOURYA S/O BABU LAL---- AGE - 37 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.31/99, U/S-302/396/34 IPC, Police Station Bara Hindu Rao Delhi for murder of a lady while committing dacoity.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 17 years, 01 month & 24 days excluding the remission as on 31ST of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 20 years, 04 months & 11 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 03 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail.

The Delhi Police has opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. The home town police has also opposed the premature release. The Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his case for premature release. Home town Probation officer has opposed his premature release. Ld. Addl. Session Judge opposed the premature release of above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, recommendations of Probation Officer and satisfactory work & conduct in jail as well as outside during parole/furlough, the Board **RECOMMENDS** the premature release of the convict.

5. SHIV RAM @ CHOTU S/O MUNNA LAL--- AGE -36Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.31/99, U/S-302/396/34 IPC, Police Station Bara Hindu Rao Delhi for murder of a lady while committing dacoity.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 17 years, 01 month & 24 day excluding the remission as on 31ST of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 20 years, 04 months & 11 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 05 times and furlough 01 time. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail.

The Delhi Police has opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. Report from his home town police is not received in spite of multiple messages, thus, presumed not opposed. The Probation Officer Delhi has recommended his case for premature release. Social investigation report from his home town has not received in spite of multiple message, thus, presumed not opposed. Ld. Addl. Session Judge opposed the premature release of above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, recommendations of Probation Officer and satisfactory work & conduct in jail as well as outside during parole/furlough, the Board **RECOMMENDS** the premature release of the convict.

6. GULAMUDDINS/O JAVED SHEIKH---- AGE - 49 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.31/99, U/S-302/396/34 IPC Police Station Bara Hindu Rao Delhi for murder of a lady while committing dacoity.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 17 years, 01 month & 23 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 20 years, 01 months & 16 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 06 times and furlough 04 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail.

The Police has opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer has recommended his case for premature release. Ld. Addl. Session Judge opposed the premature release of above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, recommendations of Probation Officer and satisfactory work & conduct in jail as well as outside during parole/furlough, the Board **RECOMMENDS** the premature release of the convict.

7. AJAY @ BITTOO S/O OM PRAKASH---- AGE-50 YRS

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.659/01, U/s-302 IPC, Police Station Sarswati Vihar, Delhi, for committing murder of one Trilok Chand due to his personal grudge.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 03 months & 17 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 17 years, 07 months & 24 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 02 times and furlough 14 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail.

The local Police has opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer has recommended his premature release.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, recommendations of Probation Officer and satisfactory work & conduct in jail as well as outside during parole/furlough, the Board **RECOMMENDS** the premature release of the convict.

8. DEEP CHAND S/O PRATAP SINGH----59 YRS.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.302/97, U/s-302/34 IPC Police Station Trilok Puri, Delhi, for involvement in a murder of a person over some property disputes.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 02 months & 20 days excluding the remission as on 31st of November 2016. He has undergone a total period of 16 years, 10 months & 05 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed paroles 07 times and furlough 15 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough.

He is presently lodged in semi open jail. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail as well as in Semi Open Jail

The Police opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer has not recommended his premature release.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, recommendations of Probation Officer and satisfactory work & conduct in jail as well as outside during parole/furlough, the Board **RECOMMENDS** the premature release of the convict.

9. MAHESH S/O SRI PAL----AGE - 42 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.385/92, U/s-302/324 IPC, Police Station Nand Nagri for committing murder of two persons over trivial issue.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 01 months & 22 day excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 17 years, 04 months & 16 day including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 01 time and furlough 14 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough.

He is presently lodged in semi open jail. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail as well as in Semi Open Jail.

The police has opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer has recommended his premature release. Ld. Addl. Sessions Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, recommendations of Probation Officer and satisfactory work & conduct in jail/semi open jail as well as outside during parole/furlough, the Board **RECOMMENDS** the premature release of the convict.

10. ANUJ S/O MUNNI LAL----AGE -47 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.377/89, U/S-302/392/34 IPC, Police Station Trilok Puri, and Delhi for murder of a young lady and robbed his house and valuables.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 02 months & 02 day excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 16 years, 00 months & 07 day including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 02 times and furlough 04 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough.

He is presently lodged in semi open jail. The work and conduct of convict in jail and Semi Open jail has been satisfactory.

The Police has opposed his premature release in its report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer has recommended his premature release. Ld. Addl. Sessions Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, recommendations of Probation Officer and satisfactory work & conduct in jail and semi open jail as well as outside during parole/furlough, the Board **RECOMMENDS** the premature release of the convict.

11. SUSHIL KUMAR S/O PRABHU DAYAL---- AGE - 41 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.27/02, U/s-302 IPC, Police Station Adarsh Nagar, for committing murder of a person due to his personal grudge.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 00 months & 24 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 16 years, 09 months & 18 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 02 times and furlough 17 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough.

Presently he is lodged in semi open jail. His work and conduct in jail and Semi Open Jail has been satisfactory.

The Police opposed his premature release in its report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer has recommended his premature release.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, recommendations of Probation Officer and satisfactory work & conduct in jail and semi open jail as well as outside during parole/furlough, the Board **RECOMMENDS** the premature release of the convict.

12. RAVI KUMAR GHAI S/O KEWAL KISHAN GHAI -- AGE -42 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.591/2001, U/S-302 IPC, P.S. Patel Nagar, for committing murder of a girl of aged 15 years by pushing her from the roof.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 03 months & 00 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 17 years, 07 months & 00 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 01 time and furlough 02 time. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in the jail.

The Delhi Police opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his premature release. Ld. Addl. Sessions Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, nature of crime, non recommendation of police, opposed by Ld ASJ, the Board **REJECTS** the premature release of the convict.

13. KUTTU S/O RAJJU - AGED- 68

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 211/1995, U/S-302 IPC, P.S. Sultanpuri, for committing murder of a person over personal dispute.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 03 months & 27 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 17 years, 07 months & 05 days including the remission earned by him. He has not availed any parole/furlough till date due to lack of surety. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in the jail.

The Delhi Police opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his premature release.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, old age of the convict i.e. 68 years, recommendations of Probation Officer and satisfactory work & conduct in jail, the Board **RECOMMENDS** the premature release of the convict.

<u>14. GYAN CHAND KASHYAP @ KALU S/O JAGAT NARAIN---- AGE - 36 Yrs.</u>

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.786/2000, U/S-302/364 IPC Police Station- Uttam Nagar Delhi, for kidnapping and murder of a Driver of travel agency to grab the van they hired.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 15 years, 04 months and 13 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 18 years, 03 months & 02 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 05 times and furlough 04 times, nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail.

The Police report has not opposed his premature release in its report but opposed in the meeting. The Probation Officer has recommended the premature release of said convict. Ld. Addl. Sessions Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, nature of crime, non recommendation by police, opposed by Ld. ASJ, the Board **REJECTS** the premature release of the convict.

15. DHARMENDER SINGH @ VIJAY S/O KALU PRASAD---- AGE -35 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.786/2000, U/S-302/364/34 IPC Police Station Uttam Nagar, Delhi, for kidnapping and murder of a Driver of travel agency to grab the van they hired.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 01 month & 19 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 16 years, 01 months & 14 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 07 times and furlough 05 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough. His work and conduct in jail has been satisfactory.

The Police has opposed the premature release of said convict in its report as well as in the meeting. The Chief Probation Officer has recommended the premature release of the convict. Ld. Addl. Sessions Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, nature of crime, non recommendation by police, opposed by Ld. ASJ, the Board **REJECTS** the premature release of the convict.

16. CHINTU MALHOTRA @ ANURAG S/O CHAMAN LAL MALHOTRA--- AGE - 35 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.787/2000, U/S-302/364/34 IPC, Police Station Uttam Nagar, Delhi, for kidnapping and murder of a Driver of travel agency to grab the van they hired.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 05 months & 24 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 16 years 04 months & 24 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 05 times and furlough 03 times. He jumped furlough w.e.f. 15.01.15 to 20.12.15 and rearrested on 21.12.15. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail.

The Police opposed premature release in its report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer has recommended the premature release of convict. Ld. Addl. Session Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, nature of crime, furlough jumped, non recommendation by police, opposed by Ld. ASJ, the Board **REJECTS** the premature release of the convict.

17. MD. TAYYAB ALAM S/O MD. SAGEER----AGE - 36Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.787/2000, U/S-302/364/34 IPC, Police Station Uttam Nagar, Delhi, for kidnapping and murder of one Driver Krishan Kumar to grab the van he along with his co-accused hired. The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 15 years, 04 month & 28 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 18 years, 01 month & 11 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 01 time and furlough on 04 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail.

The Police has opposed his premature release in its report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer has recommended his case for premature release. Ld. Addl. Session Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, nature of crime, non recommendation by police, opposed by Ld. ASJ, the Board **REJECTS** the premature release of the convict.

18. SHYAM NARAIN S/O TABALI RAM----AGE-41 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.524/03, U/s-376(2) IPC Police Station Kalyan Puri, Delhi, for committing rape of a girl 7 ¹/₂ years.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 12 years, 04 month & 21 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 14 years, 03 month & 26 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 04 times. Nothing adverse reported against him during parole. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail.

The Delhi Police has opposed his premature release in its report as well as in the meeting. Home town police has not recommended for his premature release. The Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his premature release. The Probation Officer of Home town has not recommended his premature release. Ld. Addl. Session Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, nature of crime, non recommendation by police, opposed by Ld. ASJ, the Board **REJECTS** the premature release of the convict.

19. SATENDER SINGH S/O PARMANAND----AGE – 42 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.247/03, U/S-376(2)(g)/366/394 IPC, Police Station Chanakya Puri, Delhi, for committing rape a young girl and robbed her in Budha Garden along with accomplice.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 12 years, 05 month & 09 day excluding the remission as on 31st March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 14 years, 07 month & 09 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 03 times and furlough 05 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail.

He has undergone a total period of 16 years, 03 months & 13 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 02 times and furlough 04 times. Nothing adverse reported against him during parole /furlough. His work and conduct in jail has been satisfactory.

The Delhi Police opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. Home town police has also opposed his premature released. The Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his case. Report from home town Probation officer not received in spite of multiple messages. Ld. Addl. Session Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, nature of crime, non recommendation by police, opposed by Ld. ASJ, the Board **REJECTS** the premature release of the convict.

21. BABU LAL S/O BALWANT SINGH----AGE --53 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.210/87, U/S-302364/201/120-B IPC, Police Station- Sultan Puri, Delhi, for kidnapping and murder of a girl child.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 17 years, 07 months & 28 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 22 years, 06 months & 23 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed 02 paroles and 03 furlough, nothing adverse reported against him during parole/furlough. His work and conduct in jail has been satisfactory.

The Delhi Police has opposed premature release in report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer has recommended premature release of the convict. Ld. Addl. Session Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict. After taking into account overall facts of the case, nature of crime, non recommendation of Ld. ASJ and police, the Board **REJECTS** the premature release of the convict.

22. MD.KHALID S/O MD. AJIZ---- AGE - 47Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.910/2000 U/S-302/34 IPC, Police Station- Sultan Puri, Delhi, for the committing murder of a person due to his personal grudge. He has been also convicted in case ST No. 172/99, u/s 364/302/149/201 IPC, P.S. Bahadurgarh, Ghaziabad, U.P. (Presently on Bail from Allahabad High Court in a pending Appeal)

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 15 years, 05 months & 12 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 18 years, 09 months & 14 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed 01 parole and 01 furlough. His conduct has been satisfactory for last 03 years in jail.

The Police has opposed premature release of the convict in reports as well as in meeting. The Probation Officer has recommended premature release of the convict. Ld. Addl. Session Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account overall facts of the case, the non recommendation of Ld. ASJ and police, involvement in multiple crimes, the Board **REJECTS** the premature release of the convict.

23. RAMESH @ RAMESHI @ VINOD S/O MANGAL SINGH----AGE - 42 Yrs.

The Police and Probation officer have opposed the premature release of the convict in their reports as well as in meeting. Ld. Addl. Session Judge has also opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account overall facts of the case, nature of crime, the non recommendation of Ld. ASJ, probation officer and police, multiple jail punishments, unsatisfactory jail conduct, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

24. AJAY KUMAR @ AJJU S/O RAM KISHAN----42Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.986/2000, U/s-302/201/34 IPC Police Station- Uttam Nagar, Delhi, for committing murder of a person due to his personal enmity.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 15 years, 05 months and 25 days excluding the remission as on 31^{st} of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 16 years, 03 months & 15 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed 03 parole and surrendered late on one occasion. His conduct has not been satisfactory in jail.

The Police has opposed for premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. Also, the Probation Officer has not recommended his case for premature release. Ld. Addl. Session Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account overall facts of the case, non recommendation of police, Probation Officer and Ld. ASJ, unsatisfactory jail conduct and his involvement in multiple criminal cases, the Board **REJECTES** the premature release of the convict.

25. VIJAYPAL S/O GOPI CHAND- Aged-39 Years

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.235/2001, U/S-302/201/120b/34 IPC P.S. Vasant Kunj, for committing murder of his wife.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 05 months & 28 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 16 years, 09 months & 00 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 07 time and furlough 12 time. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough.

He is presently lodged in semi open jail. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail as well as semi open jail.

The Delhi Police has opposed for premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting. The Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his premature release.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, recommendations of Probation Officer and satisfactory work & conduct in jail/semi open jail as well as outside during parole/furlough, the Board **RECOMMENDS** the premature release of the convict.

26. DOST MOHD S/O ASHRAF ALI – AGED 51 YEARS

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.107/2001, U/S-302/201/120B IPC P.S. Seema Puri, for committing murder of Hasan Ali.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 00 months & 28 days excluding the remission as on 31st of March 2016. He has undergone a total period of 16 years, 07 months & 03 days including the remission earned by him.

He has availed I.Bail 02 times, parole 02 times and furlough 11 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough.

He is presently lodged in semi open jail. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail as well as semi open jail.

The Police has not opposed for premature release of the convict in its report but opposed in the meeting. The Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his case for premature release. Ld. Addl. Session Judge has opposed the premature release for above said convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, recommendations of Probation Officer and satisfactory work & conduct in jail/semi open jail as well as outside during parole/furlough, the Board **RECOMMENDS** the premature release of the convict.

Out of 26 cases placed before the Sentence Reviewing Board, 12 cases have been recommended and 14 cases have been rejected.

20. <u>SUBHASH S/O BHUJARATH----AGE – 33 Yrs.</u>

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.378/01, U/s-302/34 IPC, Police Station Subzi Mandi, Delhi, for committing murder of one Mukesh Kumar due to personal grudge.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years & 16 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. He has undergone a total period of 17 years, 08 months & 14 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 02 times and furlough 02 times. Nothing adverse has been reported during parole/furlough. He had participated in vocational and spiritual courses held in jail. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail during parole/furlough.

The Delhi Police opposed premature release of in its report as well as in the meeting in view of gravity of offence. Home town police has opposed premature release in view of law & order problem. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his case for premature release. Home town Social Welfare report has not been received inspite of multiple messages, thus presumed as not opposed.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, satisfactory work and conduct and recommendations of Chief Probation Officer, the Board **<u>RECOMMENDS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

21. <u>VIJAY S/O HARI NARAYAN---- AGE – 39 Yrs.</u>

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.168/2001 U/s-302/368/34 IPC, Police Station Kapashera, Delhi, for kidnapping and murder of boy of aged 12 years for ransom.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 01 months & 13 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. He has undergone a total period of 17 years, 10 months & 06 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 05 times and furlough 06 times. Nothing adverse reported against him during parole/furlough. He participated in educational, vocational and spiritual courses held in jail.

He is presently lodged in **SEMI OPEN JAIL** since 24.10.2014 and pursuing work at **TIHAR HAAT**.

The Ld. Addl. Session Judge opposed the premature release in view of gravity of offence and heinous nature of crime. The Delhi Police opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting in view of gravity of offence. Home town police report is awaited inspite of multiple messages, thus presumed as not opposed. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his case for premature release of the convict. The report from home town Chief Probation Officer is awaited inspite of multiple messages, thus presumed as not opposed.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, gravity of offence committed by convict, non recommendations of police and Ld. ASJ, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

22. <u>PARVINDER @ PINKI S/O JAI PRAKASH---- AGE – 45 Yrs.</u>

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.261/93, U/S-302/307/34 IPC Police Station Chanakya Puri, Delhi, for committing murder of one Kadam Sinigh due to his personal grudge.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 01 months & 13 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. He has undergone a total period of 17 years, 10 months & 06 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 02 times and furlough 16 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough. He has participated in vocational and spiritual courses held in jail.

He is presently lodged in **SEMI OPEN JAIL** and pursuing His work at **TIHAR HAAT**. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in the jail as well as in Semi Open Jail.

The Police opposed premature release of convict in its report as well as in the meeting in view of serious nature of offence. The Chief Probation Officer, has recommended premature release of the convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, satisfactory work and conduct in jail and recommendations of Chief Probation Officer, the Board **<u>RECOMMENDS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

23. RAM PRAVESH @ KABRI S/O MANOHAR MUKHIYA---- AGE --32 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.260/2001 &414/2001 U/S-302 IPC & 25 A. Act P.S. Roop Nagar & Kamla Nagar, Delhi, for committing murder of one Ajay due to his personal grudge.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, & 15 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. He has undergone a total period of 16 years, 11 months & 10 days including the remission earned by him. No parole/furlough availed by him. Jail conduct of the convict is not satisfactory in view of his 06 jail punishments.

The Delhi Police opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting in view of gravity of offence and law & order problem. Home town police report is awaited inspite of multiple messages, thus presumed as not opposed. The Chief Probation Officer, both Delhi & home town has not opposed his premature release.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, unsatisfactory jail conduct in view of jail punishments and non recommendations of police, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

24. <u>HARPREET SINGH S/O AMRIK SINGH----AGE – 32 Yrs.</u>

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.147/2003, U/S 366/376/394/34IPC, Police Station Chankya Puri, Delhi for committing rape of a young girl forcibly.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 12 years, 01 month & 23 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. He has undergone a total period of 14 years, 02 months & 05 day including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 02 time and furlough 04 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough. He participated in vocational and spiritual courses held in jail. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail.

The Ld. Addl. Session Judge opposed the premature release in view of heinous nature of offence. The report from Delhi Police is awaited inspite of multiple messages, thus presumed as not opposed, but opposed in the meeting in view of heinous nature of crime and gravity of offence. The home town police has not opposed his premature release. The Delhi Chief Probation Officer has recommended premature release of the convict. Report from home town is awaited inspite of multiple messages, thus presumed not opposed.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, heinous nature of crime, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

25. <u>HARISH S/O RAJA RAM---- AGE – 33 years.</u>

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.702/99 U/S-376/302/201/436/34 IPC, Police Station, Mehrauli, Delhi, for the committing rape and murder of a girl aged 12 years.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 16 years, 01 months & 04 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. He has undergone a total period of 20

years, 09 months & 19 days including the remission earned by him. He availed parole 01 time and furlough 02 times. Nothing adverse reported against him during parole/furlough. He participated in vocational and spiritual courses held in jail.

The Ld. Addl. Session Judged opposed the premature release. The Police strongly opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting in view of heinous nature of crime and law & order problem. The home town police has not opposed his premature release. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended premature release of the convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, the heinous nature of crime, non recommendation by Delhi police, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

26. OMBIR SINGH S/O GIRI RAJ ---- AGE -38 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.928/03, U/S-324/325/3342/376(2)F. IPC Police Station Uttam Nagar, Delhi, for committing rape of a girl aged 11 years.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 12 years, 01 months & 21 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. He has undergone a total period of 14 years, 10 months & 15 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 04 times and furlough 06 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/furlough. He participated in spiritual courses held in jail. His work and conduct is satisfactory in jail.

The Ld. Addl. Session Judge apposed the premature release in view of nature and gravity of offence. The Police opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting in view of heinous nature of crime. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his premature release.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, heinous nature of crime and non recommendations of police, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

The Ld. Addl. Session Judge opposed the premature release in view of nature and gravity of offence. The Delhi Police opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting in view of possibility of indulgding in similar crime. Police report from his home town has not been received inspite of multiple messages, thus presumed as not opposed. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi recommended his case for premature release. Home town Social Welfare Officer has not opposed the premature release. He has availed 01 time. Nothing adverse reported against him during parole. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail. He participated in vocational and spiritual course held in jail.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, the heinous nature of crime, non recommendations of police, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

28. RAJU S/O DEV SARAN----AGE-52 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.554/94, U/S-376/302 IPC, Police Station Vasant Kunj,Delhi, for committing murder rape and murder of a girl of aged 11 years.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 17 years, 02 month & 05 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. He has undergone a total period of 22 years, 03 months & 22 day including the remission earned by him. He has not availed any parole/furlough. His work and conduct has been satisfactory in jail. He participated in vocational and spiritual course held in jail.

The Ld. Addl. Session Judge apposed the premature release in view of nature and gravity of offence. Police has not opposed his premature release in the report as no one is residing at the given address, but police opposed in the meeting in view of heinous nature of crime. Home town report is awaited inspite of multiple messages, thus presumed not opposed The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his case for premature release. Home town social welfare officer has not opposed his release.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, heinous nature of crime, non recommendation of police, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

29. RAJAB ALI @ BABLU S/O LIYAKAT ALI---- AGE – 33 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.16/03, U/S-376 IPC, Police Station Gandhi Nagar, Delhi, for committing rape of a girl aged 06 years.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 12 years, 05 months & 19 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. He has undergone a total period of 15 years, 07 months & 04 days including the remission earned by him. He has availed parole 03 time and furlough 01 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole/ furlough. He had participated in spiritual courses held in jail.

The Ld. Addl. Session Judge opposed the premature release in view of nature and gravity of offence. The Chief Probation Officer has recommended premature release of the convict.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, heinous nature of crime, non recommendations of police, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

30. ANIL KUMAR SHARMA SON OF VISHNU DUTT SHARMA ----AGE - 66 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 12/92, U/S-302/377 IPC, Police Station Chankaya Puri, Delhi, for committing sadomize and murder of boy aged 08 years.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 14 years, 05 months & 23 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. He has undergone a total period of 17 years, 03 months & 29 days including the remission earned by him. He has not yet availed parole/furlough, He has participated in educational, vocational and spiritual courses held in jail. The work and conduct of the said convict has been satisfactory in jail.

The Ld. Addl. Session Judge opposed the premature release in view of nature and gravity of offence. The Delhi Police not opposed premature release of the convict in its report as he is resident of U.P., but opposed in the meeting in view of heinous nature of crime and gravity of offence. The home town Police has not opposed premature release of the convict in view of possibility of indulgding in crime. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his premature release. Social Investigation Report from his home town has not been received in spite of several messages, thus presumed as not opposed.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, heinous nature of crime and non recommendations of police, the Board **REJECTS** the premature release of the convict.

31. MD. SAYYED S/O ABDUL RASHID----AGE –52 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.658/94, U/S-121/122/

124-A/364/364-A/34 IPC R/W SECTION 3(2)(1)120-B TADA ACT P.S. Connaught Place, Delhi, for committing kidnapping, murder and terrorist activities in India.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 20 years, 11 months & 23 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. No remission is to be given to him in terms of Hon'ble Supreme Court order. He has availed parole 08 times. Nothing adverse has been reported against him during parole. He learnt weaving work in jail factory. His work and conduct in jail has been satisfactory in jail.

The Police opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting in view of gravity of offence and heinous nature of crime. Home town police report is awaited inspite of multiple messages, thus presumed not opposed. The Chief Probation Officer has not opposed his premature release. Home town social investigation report is awaited ispite of multiple messages, thus presumed not opposed.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, gravity of offence and involvement in terrorist activities in India and non recommendations by police the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

32. <u>NAZIR KHAN @ SAIFULLA @ MD AKRAM S/O HAZI LAL KHAN--(PAK</u> <u>NATIONAL) AGE – 45 Yrs.</u>

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.658/94, U/S-121/122/124-A/364/364-A/34 IPC R/W SECTION 3(2)(1)120-B& 3 / 4 TADA ACT P.S. Connaught Place, for committing murder for committing kidnapping, murder and terrorist activities in India. The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 20 years, 11 months & 29 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. No remission is to be given in terms of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. No parole/furlough is availed by him.

The local Police opposed premature release of the convict in its report as well as in the meeting in view of gravity of offence and heinous nature of crime. Report from his home town i.e. Pakistan is awaited. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has recommended his premature release. Social verification report from his home town i.e. from Pakistan is not received.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, gravity of offence and involvement in terrorist activities in India and non recommendations by police, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

33. ABDUL RAHIM S/O MAJID KHAN----(PAK NATIONAL)----AGE – 43 Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.658/94, U/S-121/122/124-A/364/364-A/34 IPC R/W SECTION 3(2)(1)120-B & 3/4 TADA ACT P.S. Connaught Place, for committing murder for committing kidnapping, murder and terrorist activities in India.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 20 years, 07 months & 02 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. No remission is to be given in terms of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. No parole/furlough availed by him.

The police report is awaited despite multiple messages, but opposed in the meeting. Home town police report i.e. from Pakistan is awaited. The Chief Probation Officer has recommended his premature release.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, gravity of offence and involvement in terrorist activities in India, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.

34. MD. NAUSHAD S/O ABDUL RASHID----AGE –51Yrs.

The convict is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.517/96, U/S-302/307/120-B/124/212 IPC & 3/4/5 Explosive ACT & 25 ARMS ACT Police Station Lajpat Nagar, Delhi, causing death of people by plantation of Bomb and its explosion in Lajpat Central Market, Delhi in 1996.

The convict has already undergone an actual sentence of 19 years, 05 months & 02 days excluding the remission as on 30th of November 2015. He has undergone a total period of 20 years, 04 months & 21 days including the remission earned by him. No parole/furlough availed by him. His work and conduct has been unsatisfactory.

The Police report is awaited inspite of multiple messages, but opposed in the meeting. The Chief Probation Officer Delhi has recommended his premature release.

After taking into account the overall facts of the case, gravity of offence, involvement in the terrorist activities and unsatisfactory conduct in jail, the Board **<u>REJECTS</u>** the premature release of the convict.
