RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SENTENCE REVIEW BOARD FOR PREMATURE RELEASE OF LIFE CONVICTS IN THE MEETING HELD UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE HON'BLE HOME MINISTER OF DELHI AT 03:00 PM ON 25th June, 2021, AT DELHI SECRETARIAT, NEW DELHI- 110002.

The Sentence Review Board met on 25.06.2021 at 03:00 PM to consider the fresh and rejected cases for premature release of convicts undergoing Life sentence in pursuance to the meeting notice received from Dy. Secretary (Home), GNCT of Delhi vide reference no. F.18/78/2002/HG/1271-78 dated 09.06.2021. Rejected cases of the previous meetings were also considered in view of the amended Rule 1257 (d) of DPR, 2018 vide notification no. F.18/191/2015-HG/1840-1853 dated 08.06.2020 provides that "...rejected cases can be considered prior to the expiry of a period of six months, if the Chairman of the Sentence Review Board so decides."

A total of 179 numbers of cases of life convicts were placed before the Board (43 fresh cases, 01 deferred case of last meeting dated 11.12.2020 & 135 rejected cases by the Board in its previous meetings).

All the cases put forth before the Board were discussed at length and considered in the light of parameters as mentioned in Delhi Prison Rules, 2018. Factors like conduct of the prisoner during confinement, his/her age, the circumstances under which the crime was committed (premeditated or in spur of the moment), nature & gravity of crime, perversity and brutality of the offence committed by the convict, whether the convict is casual or habitual offender, his/her antecedents, apprehension expressed by his/her family members, propensity of committing crime again or not, his lodgment, parole/furlough availed and conduct during parole/furlough as well as in Jail, prospects of post release rehabilitation, family responsibilities, possibility of the convict to return as a useful member of the society and his socio-economic condition etc. were also considered by the Board and accordingly its recommendations were given.

The Board was informed about the following:-

- (I) That the recommendation by the Board for premature release of the convicts are subject to the approval of Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor, Govt. of National Capital Territory of Delhi.
- (II) Cases falling under Section 435 Cr.P.C. are subject to the consultation with Central Government (MHA), Govt. of India (e.g. CBI cases etc.), if any.
- (III) That the custody period i.e. expired portion of sentence in all cases placed before the Board has been computed as on 31.03.2021.

01. ANIL S/O SH. RAJENDER SINGH — AGE-45 YRS.

Anil S/o Sh. Rajender Singh is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 887/2006, U/S 302/307/120-B/34 IPC & 27 A. Act, P.S. Punjabi Bagh, Delhi for murder of a person over love affair.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years and 29 days **in actual** and 16 years, 04 months and 09 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 03 times and Furlough 12 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has opposed his premature release in its report as well as in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **recommended** his premature release in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has also **supported** premature release of the convict in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, consistent satisfactory jail conduct throughout incarceration, no adverse report during parole and furlough availed, no propensity of committing crime again etc., the Board **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Anil S/o Sh. Rajender Singh.

<u>02. ANIL KUMAR S/O SH. MAHI PAL — AGE-37 YRS.</u>

Anil Kumar S/o Sh. Mahi Pal is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 69/2007, U/S 302/365/364/328/120-B/392/411 IPC, P.S. M. S. Park, Delhi for kidnapping, robbing ornaments and murder of a woman.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 01 Month and 01 day **in actual** and 16 years, 03 months and 19 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 01 time and Furlough 11 times.

Recommendation by Police:

As per report of Delhi Police address of the convict could not be verified. Hometown Police has neither recommended nor opposed his premature release in its report. The Dy. Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime & Legal) has **opposed** his premature release in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

Report form Social Welfare Department, Delhi has not been received. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has **not supported** the premature release of the convict in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances under which the crime was committed i.e. committing murder of a woman after kidnapping and robbing her ornaments, gravity and perversity of the crime etc., the Board **REJECTS** premature release of convict Anil Kumar S/o Sh. Mahi Pal at this stage.

<u>03. ASHOK KHATRI S/O SH. DHARAMPAL — AGE-50 YRS.</u>

Ashok Khatri S/o Sh. Dharampal is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 497/2005, U/S 302/307/147/148/149 IPC, P.S. Model Town, Delhi for murder of his business partner.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 02 months and 01 day **in actual** and 17 years, 10 days **with remission**. He has availed I. Bail 01 time, Parole 07 times and Furlough 15 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has neither recommended nor opposed his premature release in its report. However, the Deputy Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime & Legal) has stated that in view of the discussions his premature release may be considered.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has **recommended** his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case i.e. the convict having no previous criminal history, satisfactory jail conduct, nothing adverse reported during interim bail/parole/furlough period, all the co-convicts have already been released etc., the Board **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Ashok Khatri S/o Sh. Dharampal.

04. BALBIR SINGH S/O SH. BABU LAL — AGE-54 YRS.

Balbir Singh S/o Sh. Babu Lal is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 23/2007, U/S 302 IPC P.S. Nabi Karim, Delhi for murdering his wife due to domestic dispute.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 01 month and 18 days **in actual** and 18 years, 01 month and 23 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 01 time and Furlough 07 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has not recommended & strongly opposed his premature release in its report. However, the Dy. Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime & Legal) has stated that in view of the discussions his premature release may be considered.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **recommended** premature release of the convict in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has also **supported** for his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case i.e. the convict having no previous criminal history, satisfactory jail conduct during incarceration, nothing adverse reported during parole/furlough availed, showing good and reformative attitude etc., the Board **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Balbir Singh S/o Sh. Babu Lal.

<u>05. BAL KISHAN LAMBA S/O SH. BALDEV RAJ LAMBA — AGE-43 YRS</u>.

Bal Kishan Lamba S/o Sh. Baldev Raj Lamba is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 1060/2006, U/S 302 IPC, P.S. Uttam Nagar, Delhi for murdering his wife by strangulation due to domestic dispute.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 04 months and 19 days **in actual** and 16 years, 08 months and 22 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 04 times and Furlough 09 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has not recommended his premature release in its report. However, the Deputy Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime & Legal) has stated that in view of the discussions his premature release may be considered.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **recommended** premature release of the convict in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has also **supported** his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, the convict having no previous criminal history, satisfactory jail conduct, no adverse report during parole/furlough availed, showing reformative attitude etc., the Board **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Bal Kishan Lamba S/o Sh. Baldev Raj Lamba.

<u>06. DINESH KUMAR @ DINESH S/O SH. RAM DHAWAR — AGE-43 YRS.</u>

Dinesh Kumar @ Dinesh S/o Sh. Ram Dhawar is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 117/1996, U/S 302/354 IPC, P.S. Vivek Vihar, Delhi for murder of a girl by pouring kerosene upon her and setting her ablaze.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years and 04 months **in actual** and 17 years, 06 months and 06 days **with remission**. He has availed I. Bail 02 times, Parole 03 times and Furlough 14 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has neither recommended nor opposed his premature release in its report. However, the Deputy Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime & Legal) has **opposed** his premature release in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has recommended premature release of the convict in its report. However, the Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has **not supported** his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case i.e. the manner in which the crime was committed i.e. pouring kerosene and setting her ablaze, perversity & heinousness of the crime, the Board **REJECTS** premature release of convict Dinesh Kumar @ Dinesh S/o Sh. Ram Dhawar at this stage.

<u>07. GANESH S/O SH. DHARAM PAL — AGE- 35 YRS.</u>

Ganesh S/o Sh. Dharam Pal is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 26/2007, U/S 302/419/392/201 IPC, P.S. Pandav Nagar, Delhi for murdering of a person during robbery.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 01 month and 23 days **in actual** and 17 years, 01 month and 02 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 06 times and Furlough 16 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has opposed his premature release in its report. The Deputy Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime & Legal) has also opposed his premature release in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has **supported** his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account the facts and circumstances of the case, the convict having no previous criminal history, consistent satisfactory jail conduct, nothing adverse reported during parole and furlough period, shown reformative attitude and orientation towards being a useful member of the society etc., the Board **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Ganesh S/o Sh. Dharam Pal.

<u>08. HARI KISHAN S/O SH. KALESHWAR — AGE-56 YRS.</u>

Hari Kishan S/o Sh. Kaleshwar is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 82/1993, U/S 302/394 IPC, P.S. C. R. Park, Delhi for murder of a lady during robbery.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 01 month and 14 days **in actual** and 16 years, 11 months and 20 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 04 times and Furlough 06 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has **strongly opposed** his premature release in its report. The Deputy Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime & Legal) has also **opposed** his premature release in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **not recommended** the premature release of the convict in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has also **not supported** his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case under which the offence was committed i.e. murder of a lady/owner where he worked as domestic helper, gravity and perversity of the offence, strong opposition from police etc., the Board **REJECTS** premature release of convict Hari Kishan S/o Sh. Kaleshwar.

<u>09. INAL YADAV @ SHYAM SUNDER S/O SH. SARJU YADAV @ SURAJ YADAV — AGE- 59 YRS.</u>

Inal Yadav @ Shyam Sunder S/o Sh. Sarju Yadav @ Suraj Yadav is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No.490/2006, U/S 302 IPC, P.S. DBG Road, Delhi for murder of a person during quarrel.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 04 months and 05 days **in actual** and 18 years, 01 month and 17 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 04 times and Furlough 13 times.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has not recommended his premature release in its report. However, the Deputy Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime & Legal) has stated that in view of the discussions his premature release may be considered.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has **supported** his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, the convict not having any criminal history, satisfactory jail conduct during incarceration, nothing adverse reported during parole and furlough availed, showing reformative attitude etc., the Board **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Inal Yadav @ Shyam Sunder S/o Sh. Sarju Yadav @ Suraj Yadav.

10. MD. ISLAM S/O SH. BABU KHAN — AGE-38 YRS.

Md. Islam S/o Sh. Babu Khan is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 457/2006, U/S 302/201/34 IPC, P.S. New Ashok Nagar, Delhi for murder of a person during quarrel.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 04 months and 07 days **in actual** and 18 years, 03 months and 17 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 02 times and Furlough 05 times. He was arrested in other case u/s 308 IPC during furlough in 2019.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has **highly opposed** his premature release in its report. The Deputy Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime & Legal) has also **opposed** the premature release of the convict in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **not recommended** the premature release of the convict in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has also **not supported** his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, perversity of the crime, un-satisfactory conduct being involved in other case during furlough in 2019, non-reformative attitude, propensity of committing crime again etc., the Board **REJECTS** premature release of convict Md. Islam S/o Sh. Babu Khan at this stage.

11. JAHANGIR @ EKKA @ IBRAHIM S/O ABDUL HAKIM — AGE-44 YRS. (BANGLADESH NATIONAL)

Jahangir @ Ekka @ Ibrahim S/o Abdul Hakim is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 254/2003, U/S 302/34 IPC & 25 A. Act, P.S. Seema Puri, Delhi for murder of a person by bullet shot with country made pistol.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 02 months and 10 days **in actual** and 18 years, 02 months and 27 days **with remission**. He has never availed any I. Bail, Parole and Furlough.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has **neither recommended nor opposed** his premature release in its report. However, the Dy. Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime & Legal) has stated that in view of the discussions his premature release may be considered.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **not recommended** his premature release in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has also **not supported** his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances under which the crime was committed, perversity of crime, convict having criminal history and also awarded life imprisonment in other case of robbery, having not shown possibility of being reclaimed as a useful member of the society, possibility of committing crime again etc., the Board **REJECTS** premature release of convict Jahangir @ Ekka @ Ibrahim S/o Abdul Hakim at this stage.

12. MAHARAJDIN S/O SH. SHIV HARSH — AGE-44 YRS.

Maharajdin S/o Sh. Shiv Harsh is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 106/2006, U/S 302/506 IPC, P.S. DBG Road, Delhi for murder of a person over money dispute.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 04 months and 05 days **in actual** and 18 years, 04 months and 23 days **with remission**. He has availed Parole 03 times and Furlough 01 time.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has opposed his premature release in its report. However, the Deputy Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime & Legal) has stated that in view of the discussions his premature release may be considered.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has **recommended** his premature release in its report. The Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has also **supported** his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances of the case, the convict not having any criminal history, satisfactory jail conduct during incarceration, nothing adverse reported during parole and furlough availed, shown reformative attitude etc., the Board **RECOMMENDS** premature release of convict Maharajdin S/o Sh. Shiv Harsh.

13. MAZHAR-UL-ISLAM S/O WAHID AHMED — AGE-49 YRS.

Mazhar-Ul-Islam S/o Wahid Ahmed is undergoing life imprisonment in case FIR No. 615/2005, U/S 302/34 IPC, P.S. Seelam Pur, Delhi for murder of his wife by pouring kerosene upon her and setting her ablaze.

The convict has undergone:

Imprisonment of 14 years, 05 months and 10 days **in actual** and 17 years, 03 months and 07 days **with remission**. He has availed I. Bail 01 time, Parole 03 times and Furlough 08 times. He jumped parole w.e.f. 12.03.2012 and rearrested in other case on 04.04.2013.

Recommendation by Police:

The Delhi Police has **neither recommended nor opposed** his premature release in its report. The Deputy Commissioner of Delhi Police (Crime & Legal) has **opposed** the premature release of the convict in the meeting.

Recommendation by Social Welfare Department:

The Social Welfare Department, Delhi has recommended premature release of the convict in its report. However, the Chief Probation Officer, Delhi has **not supported** his premature release in the meeting.

Conclusion:

After taking into account all the facts and circumstances under which the crime was committed, gravity and perversity of the crime, jumping of parole, unsatisfactory jail conduct having multiple punishments, convict's involvement in other criminal case during parole and showing propensity to commit crime again etc. the Board **REJECTS** premature release of the convict Mazhar-Ul-Islam S/o Wahid Ahmed at this stage.

14. ZAFAR-UL-ISLAM S/O WAHID AHMED — AGE-54 YRS.

Thus, as discussed above, out of the **179** cases (43 Fresh cases, 01 deferred case of last meeting & 135 previously rejected cases) placed before the Sentence Review Board, **33** cases have been **recommended** for premature release (including one case abated due to death of the convict) and **146** cases have been **rejected**.
